### オススメの準備手順

- 1. スライドショーを作成
- 2. 各スライドに説明の原稿を書く
- 3. 読み上げソフトでイントネーションを確認
- 4. 自分で読み上げ時間をチェック→修正
- 5. 自分で読み上げて録音
- 6. 自分の録音を聞いて反省→修正・練習

### わかりやすい英語を目指して

- ・ 講演の1文は1行以内、論文でも3行以内
- 副詞・形容詞は原則禁止、接続詞は最小限に
- ・ 文章はシンプルに、語彙(類義語)は豊富に
- ・スライドは箇条書き、口頭説明のみ文章で
- ・ 大事なのはイントネーション(アクセント)、 発音は気にしない

→読み上げソフトを活用

- I heard that ..., It is said that ...は説得力無し →具体的なデータ、根拠、出典・引用元を示す
- 文章中には省略形は禁止 e.g. can't don't We're It's isn't ...etc.
- ・ 文章中でも口頭でも口語表現や俗語は禁止 e.g. I wanna It ain't We're hip about...
- 形容詞や副詞を書きたくなったら自戒 e.g. The status changed rapidly → 数値で!

### 副詞・接続詞の乱用例

- We found the fact A.

  Moreover, we found the fact B.
- We found the fact A
  In addition, we found the fact B.
- We tried the same experiment again. Surprisingly, the new reaction occurred.
- We succeeded in our experiment.
   In other words, we proved our hypothesis.
- I like traveling abroad.




## 発表スライドの原則

- フォントは、タイトル44pt. 本文28pt. 注釈18pt.以上
- 全てのページのデザイン・レイアウトを統一する
- ・ テキストも図版も必ずどこか1方向に揃える
- ・ 本文は箇条書きの短い一行文で構成
- ・文章や言葉の切れ目で改行し1 文字残りを作らない ^Orphan
- ファイル形式や提出方法は学会の指示を守る
